ASSOCIATION RULES

1. The Association shall be called the "Hertfordshire Chess Association." The object of the Association, functioning as a unit of the Southern Counties Chess Union within the British Chess Federation, shall be to foster chess in the County by all necessary and desirable means.

2. The Association shall consist of a President, Vice-Presidents, and members of affiliated clubs, and individuals who do not belong to any affiliated club in the County, and school clubs.

3. The supreme authority of the Association shall be vested in the General Meeting of its members, which alone shall have power to make and amend rules. The business of the Association shall be managed by its Executive Committee in accordance with the Rules and the decisions of the General Meeting.

4. Any chess club having its place of meeting in Hertfordshire shall be eligible for affiliation to the Association on payment of an annual subscription of 5s. 0d. per adult member and 1s. per junior member under the age of 18. Affiliated school clubs shall pay 10s. per annum. Unattached adult members shall pay 7s. 6d. and juniors under 18, 1s. The subscription from Vice-Presidents shall be at least 15s. All affiliation fees are payable on each club membership in the Association's current year—July 1st to June 30th—and shall be paid on or before November 1st. Affiliation fees in respect of members joining affiliated clubs after the date of the first payment shall be payable on or before April 30th.

5. The Executive Committee of the Association shall comprise the President, Secretary, Treasurer, Match Captain, and such other officers as may be decided upon by the Association; two delegates from each affiliated club, other than schools, and one member for every ten unattached members—provided always that this number shall be, in either case, exclusive of the members who hold executive office in the Association. The interest of school clubs shall be represented by two

delegates, one of whom shall be the Junior Chess Secretary. The officers shall be honorary. They shall retire annually, and shall be eligible for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

6. The Executive Committee shall have power to fill casual vacancies, combine offices temporarily, delegate duties to sub-committees, co-opt members for special purposes, and generally to make arrangements for the activities in furtherance of the object of the Association.

The Secretary as the chief executive officer of the Association, shall be consulted and kept in touch with affairs by all other officers with specific duties. He shall be responsible for maintaining and preserving the records of the Association, especially the Minute Books, Annual Reports, Financial Statements, and Press Cuttings likely to be of historical interest.

7. The Annual General Meeting shall be held in September, and the Executive Committee shall meet in October and July. Other meetings may be called by the Executive Committee at their discretion. A Special General Meeting shall be called by the Secretary within a month of receiving a requisition signed by ten members, and the business to be done shall be that for which the meeting is summoned and none other.

In all cases fourteen days' notice of meeting, together with an agenda shall be sent by the Secretary. Notice of Motion to be submitted to a meeting shall be forwarded to the Secretary as least fourteen clear days before the first day of the months mentioned above.

A quorum shall be fifteen for a General Meeting and seven for a Committee Meeting, and a majority of at least two to one of those present and voting shall be necessary to carry any proposal affecting rules.

8. Funds shall be expended solely on the object of the Association. Receipts and Expenditures shall be supported by vouchers and properly accounted for. There shall be an annual audit of accounts by an honorary Auditor who shall be elected at the General Meeting and not be a member of the Executive Committee.

9. The Laws of Chess as passed by the F.I.D.E. and adopted by the British Chess Federation shall govern all play conducted by the Association. Disputes and questions arising under them, as also under the rules and decisions of the Association, shall be referred to the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be binding and final. But in cases of urgency the President, Secretary and Match Captain shall act as an Emergency Committee with plenary powers.

10. The Association shall publish a Year Book setting out all its activities during the past year, and such data from affiliated clubs, as provided by them by August 31st.

COUNTY CHESS TIE

Black with two alternating stripes approximately 1½ in. apart of (Herts) blue and white and of three interminate ranks of the conventional chess-board edged on one side with a hair line of gold.

Awarded and presented to the runner-up in the Capel Cup and Burn Cup competitions.

Awarded (against payment) for at least three wins without an intervening loss in over-the-board or correspondence competitions of the S.C.C.U. and B.C.F. Also at the discretion of the Committee for any achievement of greater or equal merit. Retrospective effect. Those entitled should obtain the Match Captain's verification and apply to the Treasurer.

COMPETITION RULES

1. County Competitions and other events shall be managed by the Executive Committee, who shall group clubs and individual competitors and fix dates as may be convenient from time to time. Prompt action shall always be taken in exercise of the powers conferred by the Association rules in respect of disputes and questions.

2. The qualifications for a player in any closed competition shall be *bona fide* subscribing membership of the Association and one of the following conditions:—

- (a) Birth in the County.
- (b) Three months' immediately previous and present residence in the County.
- (c) Five consecutive years' residence in the County at any time.
- (d) Two years' immediately previous and present subscribing membership of an affiliated club.
- (e) Attendance as a master or pupil at a School or College in the County.

3. Competing clubs shall play each other in groups or sections as arranged by the Executive Committee, and the tournament shall thereafter proceed between sectional winners to its conclusion on the knock-out principle. There shall be replay in the event of a tie for sectional supremacy or of a drawn match in the County final; but should a replayed match result in a draw it shall be decided by eliminating the lowest board at which a game has been won.

4. The minimum number of boards shall be six, the period of play at least three hours, and no match shall start later than 7.30 p.m.

5. All matches shall be played with the clocks at the first six boards at least, each player making not less than thirty moves in the first seventy-five minutes nor less than six additional moves in every subsequent quarter of an hour. In individual events the rate of play shall be twenty moves per hour. Each player shall record his game as it is played, or in default shall lose all right to claim the game under the time-limit.

6. In correspondence matches replies shall be sent not later than the day after receipt of moves at the player's address, but in time to catch the post that will ensure delivery at the opponent's address on the following day.

7. Immediately before the time agreed upon for play to begin the respective captains or their deputies shall exchange lists arranged in order of playing strength and toss for the move on the odd-numbered boards.

8. Fifteen minutes' grace from the time fixed for the start of play may be claimed by the captain or his deputy in respect of any player on the list then absent; and unless within the time specified the player arrives or a substitute is found the absentee's game shall be forfeited to his opponent.

9. The position of each game legitimately left unfinished and upon which the captains or their deputies cannot decide then and there, shall be sent by each Club, with 5s. 0d. to the County Tournament Secretary, who will forward it to the Association's adjudicator.

10. The full score of every match, together with positions for adjudication (if any) shall be sent within 48 hours to the County Tournament Secretary by each of the clubs engaged.

11. The winning club shall be entitled to hold the trophy for one year from the date of the Annual General Meeting at which it is presented, and in the event of any club winning a trophy three times in succession its name shall be starred in the chess Year Book.

12. These rules shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to individual competitions. But in the case of individual matches the players shall agree beforehand to adjourn after stipulated number of moves or at a given time, and there shall be a change-over of the pieces after every drawn game.

TOURNAMENT SECRETARY'S REPORT 1960-61

The County competitions, both league and individual, were, on the whole, completed satisfactorily.

The Puller Cup was won by Stevenage, with 5½ points, with Hoddesdon and Old Elizabethans sharing second place with 5 points each.

The Montague-Jones Board was, as usual, the most difficult, especially as with so few clubs competing in the geographical sections, ties within the section itself had first to be played off before the final play-offs could begin, making the result very delayed. It was won by St. Albans. For the coming season the County will be divided into two sections—East and West—which will simplify the contest.

In the individual competitions the Capel Cup was won for the second year by J. Udris, of St. Albans, with H. J. Palmer runner-up. S. T. Berry and E. F. Norris were losing semi-finalists.

The Burn Cup was won by P. J. Unway, an unattached member from Harpenden, with B. M. Cooper, of St. Albans, runner-up. A. Colman and T. W. Y. Alderton were the losing semi-finalists.
