



It is now over two months since our Annual General Meeting, and the list of HCA officers has a distinctly new look to it! Tim Thurstan has taken on the role of President, and I wish him all the best for the future in his new role. I have enjoyed my five-year tenure as President – in particular, it was an honour to represent the Association in a number of events during our Centenary Year, and for me, the Centenary Dinner was the highlight.

As most of you will know, I am planning a move away from Hertfordshire, but at the time of writing, nothing is definitely arranged, and until I depart, I have agreed to take on the role of Equipment Curator. I expect to be playing chess in Hertfordshire for at least the early part of the season, so many of you will still see me around for a while!

Our under 125 team captain, Quazi Latif has also decided to step down, after seven years in the post, having done an excellent job developing the team into a formidable force within the SCCU. I hope his successor, Keith Woodhouse, will be able to enjoy similar success. I'm pleased to see that we have a volunteer to revive the under 150 team in the shape of Mike Price – I'm sure his election at the September Executive will be a formality, and wish him the best of luck. This will provide a much-needed opportunity for a large number of players to experience county chess – something we have missed over the last couple of seasons.

Finally, I hope you all have a successful and enjoyable coming year, both in your chess activities and life in general.

New President's Message from Tim Thurstan (September 2003)

It is a new incumbent's first task to thank his predecessor and I am delighted to be able to record on behalf of the Association our debt of gratitude to John Denton for the immense amount of hard work which he put in during his 5 years as President. His presidency was characterised not only by his support for the officers of the Association but also by his willingness to become involved not only in the more visible and pleasant tasks such as presenting prizes but also in the less glamorous tasks such as moving tables and chairs and making sandwiches (some it is rumoured even contained fillings!) At the AGM in June John was presented with the Flear Trophy for the best score in the county first team (scoring an impressive 5.5 out of 8); clearly, unlike England's cricket captains, the burden of responsibility did not harm John's play. At that AGM I presented to him, on your behalf, an engraved tankard and I am sure that you will join me in thanking John and saying to him that if you do leave Hertfordshire we hope you will keep in touch with us and remember your time here with pleasure.

I should also like to record our thanks for the huge amount of work put in over the last few years by Jeremy Fraser-Mitchell as our General Secretary. Being secretary involves a great deal of usually unsung work mainly behind the scenes ensuring that the Association runs smoothly. Without Jeremy's input in many areas the Association would be in a considerably weaker position than it is today.

This year on 6th/7th December the Association's 50th annual weekend congress will take place. I believe that this makes our congress one of the oldest in the country something in which we can all be proud. I very much hope that you will help to make the event a great success by playing or helping or simply come along and meet old friends.

19th Century Chess in Hertfordshire by Simon Cage

Most Hertfordshire players would probably be aware that the Herts. Chess Association celebrated its centenary during the 2000/2001 season. What they may *not* be aware of is that chess was actively played in Hertfordshire (and, it seems, especially in North Hertfordshire) long before the setting up of the Association.

Volume 4 of *The British Chess Magazine* of January 1884 (p.29) records that:

“On Thursday the 13th of December a match came off between the St. Alban’s and the North Herts Chess Clubs, at the headquarters of the former club. The prize was the silver Chess Challenge Cup presented to the County of Herts by Arthur Files Puller, Esq. in 1880, of which the St. Alban’s Club had been the holders until now. The score, North Herts 9½, St. Alban’s 6½, shows that the North Herts [club] won by three games, and so carried off the prize.”

February 1884 (p.58) sees a somewhat terser, but equally encouraging, note:

“A match between the N. Herts and Luton Clubs was played at Hitchin Jan. 22nd. Score – N. Herts, 11; Luton, 6.”

This was followed up in the March 1884 edition with the equally pleasing:

“The return match between the N. Herts and Luton Clubs was played at the Red Lion Hotel, Luton, on Wednesday, Feb. 20th. Luton carried all before them in the first round, winning 6½ games to 3½. However in the second bout N. Herts turned the tables and won 7½ to 2½, thus winning the match by 11 games to 9.”

April 1884 (p.129) reproduces “An instructive gamelet recently played at the North Hertfordshire Chess Club.”

[Note: the following game and annotations are from the original publication – the only liberty I have taken is to “translate” all moves into algebraic notation.]

Also during April 1884 (p.149) it was noted that:

"The Cambridge Club is also in training for their annual fight with the sister University, and encountered the North Herts Club at Baldock on the 13th *ultimo* [i.e. March]; total score – N. Herts 8; C.U. 4"

Nothing further is recorded for 1884, but in the January edition of 1885 (p.30), the following appears:

"A match between the Cambridge University Chess Club and the North Herts. Club came off on Saturday, Dec. 6th, at the C.U.C.C. room in Jesus lane, with the following result: C.U., 6; N.H., 7."

The March 1885 edition (p.108) reports the following:

"Mr. H.E. Bird gave an exhibition of simultaneous display on Tuesday, February 17th, at the North Herts. Chess Club, when he encountered nine of its strongest members, viz., the Rev. H.W. Hodgson, the Rev. W. Jowitt, the Rev. Canon Kewley, the Rev. F.F. Lambert, and Messrs. E. MacDonald, T.N. Sanders, E. Prime, W. Bracey and R.E. Sanders. With the exception of Messrs. Sanders two games were contested with each player. Mr. Bird walked from board to board and played very rapidly. A burst of applause announced that the Rev. H.W. Hodgson had defeated his redoubtable antagonist in one game; and although no other victories were won by the men of North Herts. the honour of the Club was upheld in that. Mr. E. MacDonald was credited with two drawn battles, and the Rev. Canon Kewley and Mr. R.E. Sanders with one drawn game each. The remaining thirteen games were won by the simultaneous player."

The final entry (pre-1901) in the *BCM* regarding Hertfordshire is a note on page 133 of the April 1889 issue:

"At Hatfield (Herts.), the Luton club were defeated by North Herts. on the 14th March. Score: North Herts. 7, Luton 6, drawn 1".






